National Food Policy

- Government Process and Timeline
- Food Secure Canada's Plans
- Budget 2017: Working Groups on Food in the Territories
 - Strengthen innovation in agriculture/agri-food to improve access to healthy and affordable
 - Explore role of supply management
 - Identify economic development opportunities in agri-food sector



Building off of Eat Think Vote

Northern Food Sovereignty



- National food policy that includes the northern context, and recognition of the right to food for Indigenous Peoples
- Sustainable funding for Community Food Coordinators
- A basic income floor adjusted to reflect northern costs.

Overhauling Nutrition North

- Re-allocate subsidy to include non-profit food markets & transportation of traditional foods.
- Reinstate subsidies for necessary non-food items
- Ensure the cooperation and coordination of all levels of government, service providers, departments, and organizations.
- Establish accountability mechanisms: clear timeframes and benchmarks, to address state of food insecurity in the North
